The symposium dated 7-9 February was participated by 16 foreign and 15 local delegates mainly professionals from various training organizations and decisive ministries, organizations.

As the nation paid homage to the Language Movement heroes on the International Mother Language Day, BPATC was not lag behind. To mark 21st February- Shaheed Day, bare-foot and adorned in black-and-white, BPATC faculties, staff, participants, teachers, students placed floral wreaths at the altar of Shaheed Minar of the centre and stood in silent remembrance for those who embraced martyrdom to make Bangla the state language in 1952.

School and College was held. At 9.15 am, a discussion meeting on the day was arranged. Speakers discussed about the importance, history and what should be done for the development of language. In a cultural show presented by students the martyrs of language movement was remembered. Later on, a special prayer was organized for the martyrs at the central mosque.

Blackout to mark Genocide Day observed

BPATC observed a one-minute blackout from 9:00pm to 9:01 pm across the campus in remembrance of the brutality carried out by Pakistani Army on the unarmed Bengalis on the black night of March 25 in 1971.

Before the blackout programme, special prayer for the martyrs of the black night and freedom fighters was organized after the Zuhr prayer. In the evening, discussion meeting on genocide day was held highlighting its history, importance, background etc. With deep respect, all the speakers recalled Father of the Nation Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman as Bangladesh won independence through a nine-month armed liberation war under his leadership. Lt. Col. (Retd.) Quazi Sajjad Ali Zahir, Bir Protik, Swadhinata Padak Awardee, was Chief Discussant at the program where Dr. M Aslam Alam,

Rector (Senior Secretary), BPATC was present as Chairperson.
